During the afternoon, different schools were able to showcase special music selections by their students. Sharlyn Castillo and Mathania Olivier represented RJA with a duet of *Amazing Grace*.

### RJA Adds Reading Plus Program submitted by Carol Rey

This year our school has enhanced our reading curriculum with a comprehensive on-line reading program called Reading Plus. Currently just 3rd through 6th grades are piloting this program for RJA. Reading Plus focuses on the 3 domains of reading; cognitive, physical, and emotional. The students began the year taking an assessment and then an individualized program was designed just for them. Each day the students login to their personal account and select reading material that interests them. After reading the selection, they are given 10 comprehension questions of varying types. The goal each day is to get 80% or higher in order

for it to count as part of a "combo", which is 2 scores of 80% or higher in a row. When a certain number of combos are achieved (usually 10), the student "levels up" to more difficult reading material. There are also vocabulary and visual skill activities done on a daily basis.

Every day reading class is fun in 3rd and 4th grade as students celebrate their achievements. Students receive bronze, silver, and gold stars for each combo earned and blue "diamonds" each time a student moves to the next level. There is a lot of encouragement among classmates as we enthusiastically applaud each other's accomplishments! Every student has leveled up at least one time this year, however most students progressed 3-4 levels so far! The initial goal was for everyone in the class to level up at least one time, and then we would have an ice cream sundae! Not only did we achieve that, but so much more!

### Absolute Truth

*"Truth is defined as that which corresponds to reality as perceived by God."*

~ R.C. Sproul ~

What is truth? This is the question Pilate asked Jesus, as recorded in John 18:38, just before he had Him flogged. When Pilate asked Christ this rhetorical question, he was implying that the truth is open to individual interpretation, and influenced by more than just the cold, hard facts. It's amazing that in almost 2000 years since then, the tendency for human beings to rationalize and manipulate the truth is still endless, despite our advanced knowledge, science, and alleged superior intellect. And the truth currently remains as elusive as it ever has. The reason for this is not hard to understand. Today and throughout history, whenever people see something that they don't like, doesn't fit their agenda or simply can't accept, they will attempt to justify and tailor the facts as if they were a piece of pliable clay, waiting to be molded to the artist's will, until they have a version of the truth that is agreeable to them. And in the course of time and repetition, what is not necessarily the facts becomes accepted as factual. As Vladimir Lenin, politician, revolutionary, and founder of the Russian Communist Party once so succinctly put it:

"A lie told often enough becomes the truth."

And many of us have now been taught and adopted the philosophy, "Well, that may be true for you, but not for

me. I see it (i.e. I want it) another way." Alarming, they often persist in maintaining this stance despite what the facts may demonstrate.

So, the question is; in today's world, where the growth of enlightened pseudo-intellectual thinking and postmodernism seems to be usurping the place of logic and critical thinking, slowly permeating our institutions of education, politics, media, science, and yes, even our places of worship, is there really any evidence, or even a place for "absolute truth?" Does absolute truth even exist anymore, and if so, is it even relevant or necessary?

Wikipedia's online encyclopedia defines Absolute Truth as "something that is true at all times and in all places. It is something that is always true no matter what the circumstances. It is a fact that cannot be changed." They go on to say, "One way or another, these are all truths because they are logically true." Uh oh, now we've done it, we've no doubt offended someone, somewhere. There's that ugly word that many fear and abhor...logic. It much too often infringes upon our own personalized ideas.

"A man is his own easiest dupe. For what he wishes to be true, he generally believes to be true." ~Demosthenes~

Interestingly enough, in the online Merriam-Webster's dictionary (established in 1828 by the way) no such

listing for absolute truth exists. I would have thought they had plenty of time to define a term that's been around for a while. I wonder if Merriam has a definition for "political correctness?" I'll have to check later.

Some open-minded (read-liberal) individuals today say that there is no true reality, there are only perceptions and opinions. Everything is relative. Relative to my philosophy, my personal preferences, my insights and experiences. "Who are you to tell me how I feel or how I should believe? Just because you think that way doesn't mean it's right, and that I have to think that way too." Sound familiar?

This kind of thinking relies on ideology instead of reason. Of course, if there are no absolute truths, then there are no absolute morals or ethics either. It comes down to situational ethics based on subjective (opinion) beliefs. Without a fixed point of reference, in the end, it is one subjective opinion vs another. And if I can enforce my beliefs better than you can enforce yours, it will be my way, right or wrong. As they say in the NFL, "Might makes right." And once you're at that point, you have one foot on a banana peel and the other firmly established in the state of chaos and anarchy.

But you protest, "what I believe is what most people believe."

That doesn't make it true.

"Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it." ~Matthew 7:13-14~

Statistics should not define what is right or wrong, or even normal. Statistics often determine only what is popular.

What we have to especially guard against is arguing fact vs opinion. Too often the two get mixed up. I like the room temperature to be 70 degrees. Perhaps you prefer something like 65 degrees. We can debate this particular topic until the next ice age, but ultimately, we are arguing about an opinion. Nobody wins or loses, because it is a personal preference, not a fact. Now if you want to argue about the temperature at which water freezes...you are going to lose every single time, because I'm going to take the 32 degrees side of the argument. Water freezes at 32 degrees. It can be irrefutably proven. It is an Absolute Truth!

Contrary to popular modern opinion, there are a great many absolute truths that exist. But how important is truth in the Bible? As a matter of fact, it was a point of emphasis for Christ. Jesus said "I tell you the truth" over 75 times in the Bible. The truth is talked about over 25 times in the book of John alone. In John 8:32, Jesus said, "then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (continued page 6)

I chose to start this entry with "The Gift" by Mary Oliver for several reasons. One of these reasons is as a tribute to our church members who are in situations that may cause them to question their lives and their purpose. I, at times, am in this group. At each stage of life and each situation, be it age, sickness, decreased vision and hearing, loss of a loved one, empty nest, or any emotional challenge, we can slow down and wonder. Where has the time gone? Can I meet this change at all? How does this affect my relationships with others? Then there are the even greater, very practical questions of getting food, making the steps downstairs to the laundry, continuing to serve, remaining a role model and more.

I wonder with deep respect at our elderly. I'm attracted to the grace in which they carry themselves, at the desire that

they reflect as they continue on in whatever setting they find themselves. I wonder (and struggle myself) if I can gracefully grow wiser and slower yet keep a positive attitude as they do. I wonder how those with support from family and friends compare to those who have little or no similar support. Yet I see those from all groups. I also see and hear that their church and their God, our God, is very important to them. It is He, through us, who carries them, supports them, encourages them.

I wonder at the sick in our church and neighborhoods. How do they carry on? In our church I see the grace of God carrying them. I see the ministries that they still care for and are involved in. And I say "Praise God from whom all blessings flow." I wonder at the daily challenges of illness, aging and decline. All these are transitions via grace.

Have we not seen as a church that these individuals are literally carrying their crosses patiently (and sometimes impatiently, under great hardship, and imperfectly) every day? When we serve them by phone calls, prayers, cards, gifts, friendship, we are serving Christ? We are the ones who offer a cloth to His bleeding head. Practically, for them, we are the ones who put in their name as candidates for communion each quarter. We are the ones who know where they live and stop by with a plate of brownies. (Oops, well

maybe fresh fruit salad or homemade bread!) We are the ones who are being groomed to take on their status someday and hope there are those to serve us. I know a few of these people well. I know I help them some (but not enough) and I know that I am being groomed for a more prominent role of the same sort in my neighborhood and in my larger community. I know there is a medical ministry that is waiting for me to further tap into. Do you want some help in medical ministry? I can provide some. And others can provide even more.

But I want so much to say something more. That is, sometimes we just need a friend. Jesus just needs friends. If you think that you need Him, just think of how much He needs you. In the scriptures almost all of His interactions with others were friend focused. When I was young, I used to spend time saying nothing to my dad but was so content to just sit at his side while he read the paper. I sat at his side during thunderstorms watching God's creation seize itself and split the skies. He was my friend, and I, his (My mom told me.), and we didn't have to say much to each other. So too are those who need us, just by sharing time together, sharing experiences together, sharing awareness together.

As Mary Oliver has said, "...let the heart still play its true part." We can then infer from Jesus' statement that if the truth sets us free, lies will hold us captive. Do we begin to see how vitally important knowing the truth...the unadulterated, unrationalized, uncensored truth really is?

The Absolute Truth as God sees it?

Real truth isn't open to interpretation or opinion as the majority would like it to be. You see, God's perception of reality and truth is NEVER distorted! God sees things absolutely, in black and white. It is us who so often cloud the issue. Do you think that there is a question that God can't answer definitively? There is no gray area with God. And all of our justifying isn't going to make our customized fact any truer. Not in God's eyes, or in the realm of reality.

Surprisingly, I will admit that there is a time and a place for rationalization. One of the reasons I think it is so prevalent in human nature is because it is a psychological built-in coping mechanism that every one of us has employed at some time in our lives. But there must be a very clear distinction between using it to deal with very painful and difficult situations, and using it to reshape the truth for advantage or agenda.

Ultimately, if we are seeking the absolute truth, we must put all of our bias and preconceived ideas aside, and be willing to objectively go where the evidence takes us, whether we like it or not. Of course, that can open up another can of worms as to whether the data or evidence

we are presented with is in fact accurate.

To determine the accuracy of any information you receive, you must certainly take into consideration the source. Is it trustworthy? Can it be verified? Is it logical? I submit that no matter how reliable your information is, if it is of human origin, it is vulnerable to prejudice, agenda, and error. Which brings us full circle at this point. Given the choice of believing what man says and what God says, I will refer back to the profound quote by R.C. Sproul at the beginning of this article, and is certainly worth repeating:

**"Truth is defined as that which corresponds to reality as perceived by God."**

The truth isn't going to change just because we don't like it. God knows what the absolute truth is.

Now I realize much of this may fall on deaf ears, it often does. But I want you to think of this; none of us are going to obligate or manipulate God into judging us by the rules or parameters WE create. Yet some will defiantly continue to explain, continue to defend, continue to insist there are no absolute truths. They will cling to their ideology like a life preserver in the middle of the ocean. God has given us the absolute truth. It's in His word, and in His Son. But you can continue to believe what you want to believe. Proceed at your own risk.

## Recipe of the Month by Arleen Johns

This recipe requires a little more work, but it's worth it.

¼ C soy sauce  
1 C water  
Salt to taste

Add ginger, cayenne and broccoli and cook until broccoli is done (may need to add water to steam).

### Broccoli and Tofu in Garlic Sauce

1 block extra firm tofu  
3 TBS Soy sauce,  
Ginger and garlic powders for marinade- 1 tsp each  
1 onion, diced  
4 cloves garlic, minced  
3 T olive oil  
2 cups fresh broccoli chopped  
1 ½ ginger powder (may use fresh ginger plus powder)  
1/8 tsp cayenne pepper  
3 T corn starch

Cut tofu into 1 inch cubes- marinate in soy sauce, ginger and garlic powders for 30 minutes.

Slow fry till brown. May take 30 minutes.

Sauté onions and garlic in oil until clear (to save on calories—sauté in water).

Stir in finished tofu.

Mix together corn starch, soy sauce and water, and add to fry pan, cook until sauce thickens.

Serve over rice or on a bed of rice noodles.

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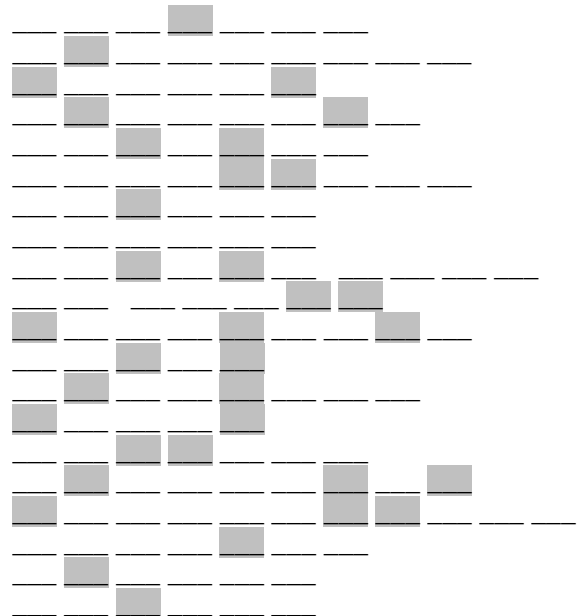
